

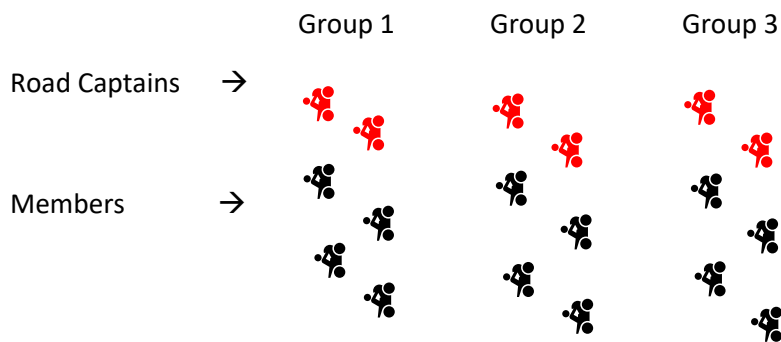
Lining Up For a ride

When lining up for a group ride we will have 2, 3 or more groups of riders, each with 2 RC's at the beginning.

Riders will be evenly distributed across the groups. By lining up in this manner we will automatically have RC pairs in the beginning, middle and end of the group. This translates into requiring at least 6 RC's to form a group of 2, 8 RC's to form a group of three, and so on. The Lead RC will determine the number of groups and where to place the RC's prior to leaving for the ride.

Group 1 will leave first, followed by group two and so on. RC's are in Red, Members are in Black

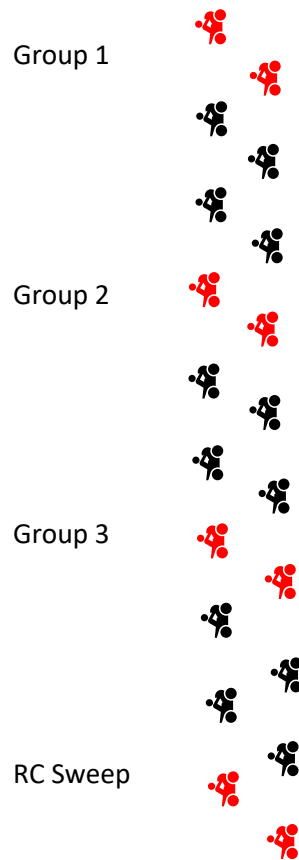
While the diagram below shows everyone in a standard staggered riding position, we may line up each group in single file at the meeting point and reform as staggered once on the road.



RC Sweep



After group 1 leaves, group 2 will follow, then group 3 and the sweep RC's. Once we are all out the group will look like this.



If we get separated between any of the groups, then one RC will act as lead and the other will drop back as sweep for that group.

If a group is split from the front with only a few riders, the leads of that group may opt to pull over and wait for the rest of the group to prevent further separation.

In the event a group is split with only one RC and it is unsafe to pull over, that RC will take the lead and keep an eye on his mirrors to ensure no one is left behind.

When groups catch-up to each other, the RC's may move back into their original pairs if safe to do so.

All groups will wait for each other at the final destination prior to entering the facility.

For long trips, e.g., off-island rides, groups will rejoin at each pre-determined gas/rest stop.

When changing lanes on the highway, members will only move over when/where safe to do so.

There is NO REASON to try and play catch-up to another group. ALL RC's will have the route and are in communication with each other. Members with CB's should not anticipate any move and simply follow the group.
