Thank you to Kelly & John for hosting another awesome Bike Night, everything was beautiful & delicious.





On October 12 HRC Chis led 9 members on 5 bikes on an overnight trip to Philadelphia to see the Eastern State Penitentiary. Leaving exit 32 at 8:30am on Saturday, the traffic gods were with us as we reached the first rest stop on the NJ Turnpike in just an hour. After that it was easy highway riding as we rode straight to the Eastern State Penitentiary. The penitentiary is an incredible, imposing structure covering 11 acres. Even in daylight it is an eerie place and we were planning to come back at night to visit the haunted house! Following our tour of the penitentiary, we headed for lunch, hoping to get a classic Philly Cheesesteak at Pat's or Geno's. These 2 Philly institutions are located across the street from each other in the middle of a crowded neighborhood, but now the parking gods were with us because just as we turned in front of Pat's a car was pulling out. We were able to get 3 bikes in that spot and the other 2 bikes quickly found a place just a few spots down. Things were definitely going our way so far, now all we needed was a place to sit down to eat as there are very few tables available considering how popular these places are. Leave it to the ladies of LIHR to find 2 tables before we even had our cheesesteaks in hand! We decided we would go with Geno's for lunch as a few of us had already been to Pat's, we weren't disappointed. After lunch we checked into the hotel to relax a bit and freshen up. The hotel was located in the historic district and we headed out to explore the area. Unfortunately the monuments closed at 5pm and we had to look at the Liberty Bell through the windows surrounding it. However, we did witness an interesting event as we watched a number of revolutionary era reenactors assemble in front of Independence Hall to celebrate as a fellow member began a walk from Philadelphia to Cambridge Massachusetts to commemorate Washington assuming command of revolutionary troops. Following the ceremony a couple of the reenactors stopped to chat with us to talk about their friend's trip. Dinner was at Moriarty's Pub down the block from the hotel. A very nice Irish Pub where we had our own bar upstairs before we sat down for some authentic Irish fare. After dinner, five of us had tickets for the haunted house and we piled into an Uber and headed back to the penitentiary. It was very crowded, but organized, as we arrived and it took about half an hour to finally get in. Once inside we visited 5 different haunted houses. Each one had a different theme and was located in a separate wing of the prison. Actors in incredible costumes and makeup roamed the grounds and the various haunted houses looking to scare the hell out of us. It was a late night as we returned to the hotel about 1:00am, and KSU was at 8:30am! We showed up neither bright-eyed nor bushy-tailed. Sunday was beautiful as we headed out towards Bucks County PA for some nice country roads. We left the city following the Schuylkill River past Museums and the beautiful boat houses of Ivy League crew teams. There was just enough fall color in the trees to make it a beautiful ride. We jumped on some larger roads to get up north so we could then hit the back Following back roads we rode through 2 covered bridges before arriving at Bowman's Hill Tower. This is a circa-1930 stone fieldstone tower that you can climb (125 steps, Jimmy Hernandez counted) and enjoy spectacular views of Bucks County. Afterwards we headed to New Hope for lunch at Ace Cafe. This is an offshoot of a famous English cafe popular with cafe racers. We arrived and there was a meetup for English cars. There were Triumphs, MG's and a Mini-Cooper. Ace Cafe is run by a husband, wife and daughter and they have on display a beautiful cafe racer that the owner rode before he put it on display in the restaurant. When we left the restaurant the cars were gone and now there were a number of cafe racers parked outside, their owners enjoying lunch at Ace Cafe. There were Moto Guzzi's, Triumphs, a BSA and a Royal Enfield. After checking out the bikes we got back and our own rides and headed back home. We hit some more back roads before getting on the highway for the final push. With the help of Waze we navigated the approach to the GWB and avoided the dreaded Cross Bronx (that included a short trip through Harlem). Approaching the Whitestone it was gridlock, and then the traffic gods smiled again. Fortunately for us (but I suppose unfortunate for the passenger) an ambulance pushed through and we were able to ride its coattail across the bridge. All arrived home safely having shared a delightful weekend with friends.



A somewhat aggressive ride was planned for Saturday morning... meet up at 32 and head North, Northwest, West and then further North. I knew this would be a bit of a stretch but, I needed to be at Mid-Hudson Sporting Range in New Paltz, NY before 12:00 noon. 





Thank goodness we were able to extend the evening an extra hour so that the chairs were able to "rut".


