



Another successful Mother's Day ride was well orchestrated on a beautiful sunny day. All the "Mom's" were so thrilled when we arrived, and a couple surprised. It was a memorable day for all the "Mom's". Many happy faces and a great tribute on a special day.



West Virginia Road Trip, 5/7-5/13

RC Jeff and RC Probie John Hachmann led 5 bikes and 5 riders on a 7 day excursion to Lewisburg WV. Jeff led 5 of the 7 days and John H led the group for days 5 & 6 of the trip. John did a great job for his first two off-island ride leads. Our first day took us down to Winchester VA for the night. It was a 50/50 mix of interstate and backroads to work our way down to Winchester. Mother Nature dampened Day 1 for the last couple of hours of the ride but the group enjoyed the route nonetheless. We made a lunch stop at the top of Tuscarora Mountain with some awesome views and then made a stop at Prospect Overlook along the Potomac River.

Day 2 took us from Winchester into Lewisburg WV with stops at Blackwater Falls, Seneca Rocks and a unique lunch spot called High's Restaurant, a former brothel believe it or not. All of the booths had signatures from all over the country so we got to add our LIHR name brand to the collection. The hotel in Lewisburg was very accommodating and they allowed us to keep the bikes under the portico to keep them out of the weather.

Days 3, 4 & 5 were all scenic loops returning back to the Lewisburg hotel. Day 3 took us to Babcock State Park which included a grist mill, a small waterfall and a picturesque lake. We also made stops at Sandstone Falls and the Greenbrier Resort Hotel which is an incredible facility steeped in a historic past. We got caught off guard by a significant rain storm between Babcock and Sandstone Falls but we regrouped, suited up and everyone pretty well dried out by days end. Lunch was a treat also at a small town diner with very friendly staff and some tasty desserts. Day 4 was a true highlight of the trip riding along some incredible roads with a stop at Cathedral Falls for many photos before continuing on to New River Gorge Bridge which is such an impressive site. The bridge is the 3rd tallest in the U.S. and 13th highest in the world. While we were taking photos of the bridge we also had two freight trains come through that run along the river. One heading northbound and another heading southbound on the opposite sides of the river. It was an impressive touch to the photo stop. On the way back along this loop we were fortunate enough to ride along Highlands Scenic Highway. A long stretch of road at 3,000-4,000 feet in elevation and truly spectacular view at overlooks where we felt we had 100 mile visibility. Day 5, the last scenic loop of the trip, took us along more incredible WV roads to the Cass Scenic Railroad yard and General Store, the Greenbank Observatory which includes a 2.3 acre telescope to monitor signs of alien life and then up to Spruce Knob which is the highest point in WV at just under 4,900'. Lunch was at the base of the mountain and it didn't disappoint. Coming out of the restaurant we were treated to a local yahoo with a hopped up old Ford pickup doing smoky donuts right in front of the restaurant and then exited the area with a 1,000' burnout. Gotta love those hillbillies!

Heading toward home on Day 6 was a combination of interstate and backroads with a stop in Harpers Ferry WV, a very historic and storied little town. We ended the day at Harley Davidson of York PA before checking into the hotel for the night. The last day of this very enjoyable overnighter started out with a little light rain that we rode out of before stopping along the NJ Turnpike. After gassing up, reality set in as we had to contend with NY traffic along the Belt Parkway and the Southern State Parkway. All in all just an awesome trip to kick off the 2023 overnighter season. WELCOME TO THE JUNGLE

Sight

When riding, where are you looking? What do you see when you look down the road? It is a pretty serious question. You go where you look. Shira seems to see to infinity. I watch my wife go through tight turns left, right, right, left... with the grace of God. Me, not so much. I am not bitter about this. I got it... she is far faster than me and I have my place in this world. But I can write. Many cannot. So now you have to deal with me and my drivel. Gawd... I adjust her chain and still change her oil. Husbandry duties and all that – you know what that is all about 'old man.' Have any of you men realized your women are better than you. They are much better than you... us. Frack me!

But, let's talk about vision. I have better vision than a space shuttle pilot. Shira cannot see squat without her specs.... Looking up. Looking forward can make or break your ride. We have talked about what we call The Flow. Do you want some of this? I think you would. This is an easy thing. A few years back I was following the redhead through Walpack Valley, one of the most remote places in New Jersey, and a dozen deer crossed her path. She brilliantly piloted the Suzuki, threading her bike in and around the deer that were scattering across the rural road.

Awesome...But how could we get by this? She was in the Flow. THE FLOW possibly can be the weapon against unforeseen and terrible mishaps. Backroads, and especially Welcome to the Jungle, is here to help us be the best riders we can be. Follow us. We can all get better... I certainly need constant betterment. Especially at this time of year. Most of us are not riding nearly as much as the warmer months and riding is a perishable skill. So, although some of us are over the winter I thought perhaps I would try to pick up some tips from Ben Collins. Ben is one of the greatest car drivers on the planet. All those cool James Bond stunts? Ben. That crazy 2017 Range Rover flying down the ski slope? Ben. Top Gear... The Stig? Ben Collins, so picking a bit off his superb book "How to Drive" seems like a good thing.

Improving your car driving helps your motorcycle riding, and Ben's book has some serious thoughts and quotes about vision from some of the very best. "If you are in a good state, psychologically speaking, your sensitivity of vision is so much greater, so much more accurate, it makes everything else much more natural and easy." Ayrton Senna - 3-Time Formula One Champion. Taking the vision thought a bit further they actually talk about juggling to improve your peripheral eye acuity. Yikes, I bought soft juggling balls years back and they have gathered dust since. Maybe I'll see if Spenser hasn't hidden them somewhere.

And, as we have talked about numerous times, Ben brings up the fighter pilot. The need, at that speed, to pick up the "Big Picture" and not get trapped by having your attention drawn into things that should not be running into your attention and focus. Fighter pilots call it "Target Fixation." Collins talks about how, on numerous occasions, pilots have followed their own bombs into the ground, or got caught up taking the Iceman's advice by literally following the wingman into the ground during formation flying. Ben Collins' hope is that we all begin to look at the bigger picture when we drive, we hope that we all do that when we ride. Take the time to get your mind right when you get going for a ride. During the winter, when in the car, try driving like you are riding the bike. It will keep you a bit sharper and make for a better spring for us all.
