"Ghost Rider: Travels on the Healing Road"

Winter is always a bit of a challenge for those of us addicted to Motorcycling. While we have enjoyed some mild weather this season, Winter is when I'm planning new routes, looking for ideas or inspiration for new rides and destinations or trying to find some new music to listen to. On one of the colder days this February, I returned home from work to find a package waiting for me on the Kitchen counter. As I picked it up, it was certainly too heavy to be that new Pat Metheny CD I had pre-ordered months ago. As I opened the package and saw the book title, it all came back to me: Ghost Rider: Travels on the Healing Road, by Neil Peart.

A few months prior, I had read with dismay of the passing of Neil Peart in January, drummer and lyricist for the band Rush. Being a music lover and playing in rock bands as a young man, I had followed this band most of their career, playing a Univox copy of the red and white Rickenbacker bass guitar that Geddy Lee had in those early days. Although I had known that Neil was an avid motorcyclist, I somehow never "got around to" reading any of his books on the topic. When he passed in January, I searched the internet to find this book and now it had arrived.

While I am only a few chapters into the book at this point, suffice it to say that his brilliant drumming and lyric writing was only the tip of the iceberg into the intellect of this incredible individual. His depth of thought and genuine writing style will captivate you from the first few sentences. This is the heartfelt story of a man who turned into a self-describe "Ghost" following multiple tragedies that no one person should ever need to endure. He brilliantly chronicles his travels along the "healing road", via Motorcycle of course. When I ordered it, I had hoped that this would not simply be a collection of journal scribblings by a hurried traveler, and it is not. There are original journal entries that are referred to and presented to the reader occasionally for detail, and their targeted placement only solidifies the reality of his journey.

Reading this book has given me a new admiration for this talented and learned man, a new appreciation for all my own wonderful friends, family, and the memories we have made together, as well as providing countless ideas for future riding, including some "Rocky Roads" even I would need to avoid!

Whether you are a fan of the band or not, I strongly urge you to read this book if you have not already done so. You will be taken on a journey of heart, mind, and soul via motorcycle. 












LIHR Annual Chili Contest February 23, 2020

February Safety Article

The Importance of Two Second Spacing

Our club has adopted the two second rule that MSF-USA.Org follows. It allows for proper group management safely while providing enough spacing time to control our group's ride. Being the seasoned riders that most of us are we can also easily fall into a pace of complacency on a ride that could have a negative impact on our fellow club members. Have you ever been on a ride where you're constantly trying to catch up and hitting speeds that do not make you comfortable? Of course you have. Its called rubber banding, where

someone falls behind our club standard two second spacing then picks it up to catch up. What that does is negatively impact the riders behind the laggard one and exacerbates the impact as the actions progress to the rear of the pack. This can repeat itself multiple times on a ride making it very uncomfortable, unpredictable and yes unsafe!!

It is absolutely imperative that we all respect our fellow club members and maintain a two second spacing, at all speeds, from the motorcycle directly in front of you. How can you do that? Just pick a marker on the road or a pole the motorcycle is passing in front of you and say to yourself in normal speech: One- One Thousand, Two- One Thousand. At the end of the 2nd One Thousand that's two seconds and where your front tire should be behind the bike in front of you. This works at all speeds the same way, the slower you go the closer you will be, the opposite for higher speeds, you'll be farther apart. Keeping alert and checking your spacing periodically will make the ride more enjoyable for all concerned keeping spacing corrections to a minimum. If you zone out and let the distance increase on you and try to catch up, remember, you are negatively impacting everyone behind you.

Also keep in mind for non-highway local rides we as a club have been blocking at certain intersections that the road captain leading the group checked out prior to the ride. When passing these blocked intersections its extremely important for the group to keep consistent spacing or an oncoming car may perceive that the group is completed, if someone is excessively behind, and attempt to make it around one of our road captains prematurely, not good! Remember, be conscience of your spacing at all times to assure a predictable and enjoyable experience.

Ride often, space yourself properly and have a blast riding at any speed.


