




Hamptons Windmill Tour October 17, 2021

NOVEMBER SAFETY ARTICLE

With all of the riding that we do individually and with the club, We need to ensure that we keep our bikes well maintained. The T-CLOCS list presented this month is a great checklist for making certain you will not experience any issues the next time you head out on the bike. I try to do this whenever I'm washing/cleaning the bike, checking for wear and tear on the tires and brakes as well as anything that may have jarred loose from rumbling down the road.




