About 1/3 of our rides have been cancelled but, somehow, we are over 10,000 miles as a club and when we add Domenic's club ride out west we get over 21,000 miles total. We manage to get it done.

Looking forward to next month's meeting, we will be having our 2nd Annual Poker Run for the Veteran's Home in Yaphank. Suffolk County United Veterans, a Project of the Association for Mental Health and Wellness was the recipient of our donation last year. www.MHAW.org/programs/scuv/what-we-do/We managed to put together



\$1,200.00 for the home and made the donation so they could have a security system installed. We went out on the poker run the morning of November 11th, Veteran's Day when it was 22 degrees out. Many members did the run and once back at the VFW we then rode out to the home and presented the donation. It's a very rewarding and fulfilling day when you meet the vets that are there. This is the first stop for many of them as they are homeless. They get meals, basic care and personal items so they can begin a new life.

This year the prizes are being donated by Miracle Mile HD, Bellmore Nassau HD, Suffolk Oakdale HD, Robkes in Northport, Dunkin Donuts, and Roslyn Eye Center. These generous donations allow all the proceeds to be given to the home and allow for us to have many prizes and enjoy the day. There will be refreshments after the run while the prizes are being distributed. Once collected the funds will be used to purchase items that the home needs. We are in touch with them already and are making plans to bring them there on Veterans Day, November 11th this year.

August 2018 Meeting

John is a member of the Syosset Fire Department and he delivered and picked up the tables and chairs. A special Thank You to Jerry and Betty Small for letting us use their beautiful house for a second year. The BBQ was a smashing success and many of our members enjoyed good food and great friends. A big shout out for Stefan and Kathy Efthimiades for all their hard work in organizing and planning, and to Lynne Ficalora and Annette Greco for the shopping. Also a big thank you to Joe Sabia and Bill Vultaggio for cooking those hot dogs, burgers and sausages. A final big thank you to all the members who brought delicious appetizers and desserts.

Ed discussed the club protocol in case of an accident. The club had two members involved in an accident. Fortunately the members are on the mend and they were able to walk away from the accident. As per protocol the sweep will stay with any member in need, the other riders will continue to ride till it is safe to pull over and a RC will be posted to direct the other members. Only the sweep will call the Lead RC to prevent too many unnecessary phone calls. Our club protocol of a two second rule between riders prevented further trouble.

The club dues will be increased for the 2019 riding season. The new cost will be \$50 for members and \$25 for associates. The extra money will help support the club to cover insurance fees and subsidize the club functions such as the monthly bagels and coffee, the Summer BBQ and the annual Christmas Party. The good news is that if the member pays his or her dues before 1/1/19 we will be offering a discounted rate of \$40 for members and \$20 for associate member—so lets all pay early!!

The Club's 2nd annual Poker Run for the veterans is planned for 9/23/18 following the monthly meeting. Each game sheet is \$20 and we have some great prizes from Miracle Mile Harley, Bellmore Harley, Dunkin Donuts, Robke's Restaurant and Roslyn Eye Center. Come out and enjoy a great day for a wonderful cause. Last year's Poker Run raised \$1,200 for the Suffolk County United Veterans Home in Yaphank, Let's see if we can top that this year. Bill Vultaggio discussed the Dee Snider ride to support Melissa's wish which provides financial assistance to the caregivers assisting those afflicted with catastrophic illness or end of life issues. Looking forward, the club is planning their annual charity ride to the Sagamore Children's Hospital on 12/2/18.

Head RC Mario reviewed the importance of passing the hand signals all the way back to end of the group. Please remember to call the RC if you are unable to make a ride you have signed up for. This year the club has completed 25 rides, 16 were cancelled for a total of 21,018 miles. Safety Officer Dom discussed the importance of the two second rule between riders and not to go around cars to stay with the ride. No member will be left behind or get lost!. Ginny discussed the importance of proper riding gear to prevent injuries in an accident such as gloves to protect your hands and fingers, a jacket and of course the proper helmet. Ginny thanked everyone for their well wishes and offers of help while she recuperates.

Our 50/50 winners were Richie Truran and George Foundotos who both graciously donated their winnings back to the club. This months pillow was won by Joe Giacalone.




Passing Without A Lane Change

Sometimes while riding there come a need to pass the vehicle in front of you.

When we pass a vehicle in a two-way environment we generally do so as fast as we prudently can - we want to get back in the lane quickly and we want to get out of harms way just as quickly, especially if there is a curve ahead or another vehicle approaching.

But what about when we are on multiple lane roads? For example, we are in the fast lane on the LIE and we are passing cars continuously. Or, more ominously, we

are not in the fast lane and there is a slowdown or severe traffic restriction (say at a congested off-ramp) in the lane next to us.



In the first example, if we are moving at normal traffic speeds - that is, if we are moving at about the same speed as other vehicles in our lane, then there should be a reasonably small speed difference between your motorcycle and those vehicles you are passing. 10 - 15 MPH is pretty normal. Our biggest risk is that a vehicle we are about to pass decides to change lanes without noticing us. Been there done that a few times and clearly you need to pay close attention with lane speed differentials that can create a crisis for you very quickly.

In the second example the speed differential between our motorcycle and the vehicles we are passing is usually much greater than in the first example. Additionally, many of the drivers of the vehicles we are passing do not want to be 'trapped' in the lane they are in and are looking for an opportunity to dart into our lane. You need to be VERY conscience of this and assume that it will happen and position yourself accordingly in the lane you are in and remember to anticipate Stuff happening. You don't want to zone out or get too complacent when riding next to a lane in excess of a 10 MPH speed differential.

I suggest that any time you are moving faster than about 5-10 MPH over the speed of the vehicles your are passing you are at significant risk of not having enough time to react to and avoid potential accidents.

It's not worth any time you might gain and to get jammed up in those kinds of situations.

- If you find yourself in the fast lane and it is traveling at a significantly faster speed than vehicles in the adjacent lane, get out of the fast lane and move right.
- If you are in a lane adjacent to one that is restricted for any reason and, thus, you are traveling at a substantial speed differential move left and away from that unnecessary danger.

You should always avoid riding in those situations where the speed differential can bring a critical situation upon you very quickly. Actually, about three weeks ago I was in the HOV lane on the LIE in my car doing about 50 MPH and a car darted out in front of me across the double line to get out of traffic. I had to jam on the brakes and veer left to avoid hitting him, if I was on my motorcycle, with a lot less rubber grabbing the road, the outcome could have been a lot worse. I thought to myself, what if I was on my motorcycle ugh, not good!

So keep in mind: Always anticipate that some moron will pull out in front of you and only do a speed you're comfortable with while positioning yourself in that lane to maximize your avenue of escape if stuff happens.
