

We rode through Sunken Meadow and Nissequogue River State Parks enjoying the views (including a majestic Bald Eagle).


We rode along the Nissequogue River and around Stony Brook Harbor before heading up to Old Field for a photo op at the Old Field Lighthouse.


Alway's with an eye out for potential new members, we convinced a young man to join us for our picture and see what it feels like to fire up a Harley.






#### Bike Night 3/28/25 NY Axe


